6. Be able to replace direct object nouns with a direct object pronoun. This will be fill in the blank. You will need to read a question in Spanish which will contain a direct object noun. The answer to the question will appear but there will be a blank for you to fill in with the correct DOP.

Example: ¿Compraste tú ese coche ayer? Sí, yo \_\_\_\_\_ compré ayer.

7. Be able to write answers to questions in the imperfect tense. of at least 8 sentences about your family, and specifically be able to talk about one family member's relationship to you, his/her name, age, physical characteristics, personality traits, likes and dislikes.

8. Be able to write a a short paragraph of about five sentences in the preterite tense describing what you did during a previous period of time, like a day ago, or last week or last year, etc.

For numbers 7 and 8 it would be good to be able to conjugate regular -ar, -er and -ir and irregular verbs covered in class activities and the vocabulary into their present, preterite, and imperfect tense forms.
